The Personal Devotional Life

Over the past year, we've been seeking God together, humbly asking Him to show us the blind spots in our lives; honestly coming clean before Him in repentance. Each month, we've been asking Him to awaken our hearts to the meaning of grace and forgiveness. We pray that your heart has been encouraged and you're newly aware of the ways that God is calling you to day by day obedience.

We'd be remiss if we merely checked off a list and stopped there. We long to cultivate an ongoing personal devotional life —devotion to Christ—so that we are faithful and fruitful throughout our entire lives. We long to be completely captured and captivated by Jesus.

As we conclude our year-long focus on the theme, "Seeking Him," we pose this final question. What is the deepest longing of your heart? If you're being honest, you might say a husband. A comfortable life. Reconciliation.

But in Psalm 27:4, David's answer to that question challenges us and motivates us:

"One thing have I asked of the Lord, that will I seek after: that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to gaze upon the beauty of the Lord and to inquire in His temple."

It's not a husband or obedient children that are going to satisfy all your needs, friends. It's not a comfortable life and secure finances that are going to make you content. It's not reconciliation or good health or your desired candidate in office that is going to bring peace to your heart. The Bible says that what brings satisfaction is "one thing" David asked of the Lord in Psalm 27. And it's "one thing" again that Martha chose in Luke 10.

Psalm 17:15 says,

"As for me, I shall behold your face in righteousness; when I awake, I shall be satisfied with your likeness."

One thing have I asked of the LORD, that will I seek after: that I may dwell in the house of the LORD all the days of my life, to gaze upon the beauty of the LORD and to inquire in his temple.

What do you seek upon waking? It's easy to reach for our phones first thing, right? We mindlessly scroll but are left wanting. But what if when we awake we purpose in our hearts to fixate on just one thing: Jesus Christ. What if we gaze intently (rather than glancing quickly) upon His beauty? What if we see Him and become like Him through the pages of scripture? What if we simply sit in His presence? What if in sitting at His feet, soaking in Him, He satisfies us fully and forever with Himself? Because that is exactly what He does. It's here in His presence that He changes us and conforms us to His image. It's in His presence that He helps us love what He loves; that He give us His perspective and peace.

And so, sisters, may this be our prayer:

"Let us know; let us press on to know the Lord" Hosea 6:3
