Grace

The world just witnessed the summer Olympics, where athletes had a brief moment to impress the judges with their skill, dedication, and sacrifice. They worked to earn favor with the judges, to show they deserved a spot on the podium. At great cost to themselves they strove to prove they were worthy of a reward. Some won medals, but many left emptyhanded.

What an opposite reality with our God! Not only do we come to Him empty-handed, with no fancy skills or extraordinary abilities to impress Him, but He isn't looking to be impressed. God isn't sitting behind a judge's bench rating our performance.

Yes, God is a judge. He is the ultimate, eternal judge. But if we have put our faith and trust in Jesus Christ, then God judges us based on the work accomplished on the cross by Jesus, and He credits that work to us. He declares we have been made righteous, not because of our work, but because of Christ's (Eph. 2:8-9). It's God's grace, an undeserved gift purchased by Christ for us.

What if Simone Biles offered to give you or me one of her gold medals? I would say there's no way I deserve it. I didn't earn it. In a much deeper and more profound way, that's like Jesus' offer to us. He paid the price, made the sacrifice, and stands victorious over death. And He offers us the reward of forgiveness and salvation. We don't deserve it. We didn't earn it. But we need it.

John Piper explains that grace is "both the inclination of the divine heart to treat us better than we deserve, and is the extension of that inclination in practical help."

Not only does God offer us the undeserved gift of saving grace, but through His grace He gives us powerful, practical help in our daily lives. We are invited to approach God's throne of grace, where He offers "grace to help in times of need" (Heb. 4:16). When we are all too aware of our weakness, God's grace is enough for us to withstand hardships with contentedness and humility (2 Cor. 12:8-10). Like giving daily manna as sustenance to the hungry Israelites, God daily feeds us more of His grace, reviving our hearts and enabling us to live humble, honest, repentant lives.

In contrast to Olympic athletes who strive to impress the judges and the world, we are reminded by Oswald Chambers that "We are not meant to be seen as God's perfect, brightshining examples, but to be seen as the everyday essence of ordinary life exhibiting the miracle of His grace." We often tumble through life like a gymnast falling off a balance beam, losing our stability and direction. God in His grace picks us up and fills our hands with more of His grace, enabling us to continue to press on in living a godly life. Our life is meant to transparently display His greatness, not ours, to display His grace, and our need for it.
