"Knitted Together" — Psalm 139.13-18 — January 15, 2017

- 1. Read Psalm 139.13-18.
- To the claim that "You cannot legislate morality," Pastor Gary argued that in reality morality is *inevitably* legislated—it's just a question of who's morality. Do you agree or disagree? Why or why not? Discuss the implications of this statement.
- 3. Who or what assigns value to each human life? Family? Government? Culture? By what standard is personal value measured?
- 4. What makes humans categorically different than rats, pigs, and dogs? What do you think it means for humans to be made "in God's image?"
- 5. If society measures the value of human life by "quality of life," then what are the implications for the pre-born, elderly, poor, and disabled?
- 6. What are the common reasons people give for justifying abortion? What do these reasons say about our priorities?
- 7. Why is it important to make sure that as we condemn the sin of abortion we also speak of the loving kindness of God? What are some wrong ways we go about speaking of these issues?
- 8. If you could communicate one thing to someone hurt by or dealing with an abortion, what would it be?
