These questions are for the September 28, 2025, message, "Complete Reversal," from the series entitled, "Seeking Him." Please read the sermon passage (2 Chronicles 30:1-9) out loud.

Passage Outline

Repentance is a change of mind which results in a change of direction, a change of life.

- 1. Repentance honors the LORD's kind authority (5-6).
 - a. "Return to the LORD" is a call to trust His kind authority over our lives.
 - b. Who is to repent? Unbelievers and believers.
 - c. Why is repentance such a big deal?
 - i. POSITIVE: in repentance we see that God is good, treasure His presence, have the power to see and reject sin, and develop a boldness in praying.
 - ii. NEGATIVE: in repentance we recognize that "living with" our sin distances us from God, exalts our puny desires, brings consequences, hurts the people we love and sometimes provokes people to sin.
- 2. Repentance makes no excuses (7).
 - a. Though Hezekiah had an immoral father and evil upbringing (2 Chron 28:1-3), he repented and called the whole nation to honor the LORD (2 Chron 29:1).
 - b. Even with a painful past, repentance is our invitation trust our faithful Father.
- 3. Repentance serves one LORD (8).
 - a. Yield yourselves to the LORD.
 - b. Come into His sanctuary.
 - c. Serve the LORD your God.
- **4.** In repentance, the LORD blesses the whole family around you (9).

Life Group Discussion Questions

- 1. Based on #1, above: It's easy to forget that even long-time believers must continue to live a life of repentance. Review the "positive effects" (how repentance helps us treasure God) and "negative effects" (how repentance helps us reject sin). Discuss.
- 2. Based on #2, above: What are some of the excuses that you have used to put off repentance, or dilute it? (My past is too broken, my pain is too great, I didn't have a good example, now is not the time, I'll disappoint someone, etc.) What does Hezekiah's decisiveness, immediacy and boldness teach you?
- 3. Based on #3, above: Read v. 8. Hezekiah's appeal was to "submission," being present at the temple (church), and service in the temple (at church). Which of these commands (submission, presence/membership or serving) settle deepest in your heart?
- 4. Based on #4, above: Discuss this: if we want to change the world, to really make the biggest difference in the midst of these crazy times, we will repent before God.
